

DRESS RULES AND REGULATIONS FOR REGISTERED EVENTS

COMPETITION ATTIRE

Competition attire is permitted to be worn by participants in Junior, Adult, Senior and Masters age groups and is restricted to events Graded from D Grade and above.

Junior Competitors are not permitted to wear tail coats or costumes with tails attached whilst competing in any registered event.

E Grade Competitors must wear Street Wear for all E Grade only events.

Juvenile Competitors are required to comply with separate dress regulations.

JUVENILE DRESS REGULATIONS FOR REGISTERED EVENTS

Juvenile dress regulations are based on the premise that, especially during their formative years, children and their parents and teachers, should have virtually no other consideration than to develop the child's technical prowess. Grooming and dress is important but should always be simple and understated.

Girls Attire – The following are allowed without trimmings:

Simple Dress

Leotard with full skirt

Blouse with full skirt

Fabric – Must be self-coloured (ie one colour) and fabrics allowed are:

Cotton, Nylon, Satin, Jersey, Georgette, Chiffon, Lycra, Velvet.

Socks/Hosiery – Skin tone hosiery or white socks can be worn.

Shoes – No slimline or high heel shoes to be worn. Shoes may have a Block or Cuban heel up to 3.5cm in height.

Makeup – No diamante or similar to be used as facial decoration. No false eye-lashes.

Hair – Sensible choice of hair style with no hairpiece, diamantes or similar to be used.

Jewellery – Minimal jewellery may be worn ie plain silver or gold ring, plain silver or gold ear studs or sleepers. No diamante or similar jewellery.

Boys Attire – The following are allowed:

Trousers – Black, Dark Grey or Navy

Shirt – White

Tie – Black for Standard (Modern), New Vogue and Classical Sequence

Bow Tie – Black for Latin American

Cummerbund – Black

Narrow Black Belt

Shoes – No restrictions

The following are not allowed:

Decoration on any part of the boy's attire including shoes

Baggie Trousers

Shoulder Pads

Extra Full Sleeves
